

#### SAINT ANTHONY OF PADUA



Saint Anthony of Padua is among the most popular saints of the Catholic Church. He was a great miracle-worker, preacher, and a profound scripture scholar, who allowed his entire being to be formed by the Word of God. He is also called the Wonder Worker due to the countless miracles that have occurred

through his intercession.

Saint Anthony was born Fernando Martins in Lisbon, Portugal, on 15<sup>th</sup>August 1195. His father was a Captain in the Royal army. Being born to a wealthy family, his parents wanted him to be successful according to standards of the world, but the saint wanted to respond to the call of the Lord. After much prayer and reflection, he left home and joined the Augustine Abbey, where he mastered scripture and became a learned scholar.

Fernando's life changed when he encountered the Franciscans in 1219. He was taken up by their evangelical poverty and simplicity. By divine inspiration, these missionaries went to preach the Gospel of Christ to the inhabitants of Morocco.Unfortunately, they were brutally martyred for their faith. This seized Fernando with an intense desire to suffer the same martyrdom. So he joined the Franciscan order and changed his name to Anthony.

His wish was to be sent to the missions in Africa, but God had decreed otherwise. St. Anthony barely set foot in Africa, when he took seriously ill forcing him to return to Portugal. On his return voyage, the ship, due to the storm, landed the Saint on the shores of Sicily. Here he met the Franciscans who gave him shelter and care and eventually sent him to a quiet convent in a place called Forli (in Italy) to serve as Chaplain to the hermits.

Anthony's brilliance as a preacher was discovered by accident, when while attending an ordination ceremony, he was forced to deliver a sermon due to the absence of the preacher who had taken ill. His eloquence and learning amazed the congregation to such an extent, that when St. Francis of Assisi heard about it, he summoned Anthony and asked him to preach throughout Italy and also commissioned him to teach theology to the Friars.

It is said that wherever the saint preached, he drew such large crowds that no church was big enough to hold them - he therefore preached in the open air. He knew how to draw souls to Christ. Hence began a huge number of conversions. He performed many miracles; the sick recovered; many repented and received Christ as their saviour. He defended the truth of the Catholic faith with such effectiveness that many heretics returned to the Catholic Church. This inspired Pope Gregory IX to call him "the Ark of the Covenant."

He had a profound love for the Eucharist. It is believed that once when the saint was preaching, illustrating the reality of the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, the leader of the heresy who did not accept the teaching told Anthony, "if you want us to believe in the mystery, we will have a mule starved for three consecutive days, and thereafter the mule will be brought before the sacrament. If the mule disregards the hay kept before her and goes and kneels and adores your bread, I will then adore it and believe in it." Saint Anthony accepted the challenge. He prayed and brought the Eucharist at the appointed time. To the dismay of the crowd the mule giving no attention to the food, walked step by step to the Eucharist which Saint Anthony was holding, and respectfully genuflected on both knees before the sacred elevated host of Christ. The heretic, Bonillo by name, fulfilled his promise and converted with all his heart to the Catholic faith.

St. Anthony spent many hours at night in prayer and in intimate union with God. Once, a man who spent the night in the home of the saint found the Saint holding in his arms the child Jesus, who looked unspeakably beautiful and was surrounded with a heavenly light. This is why statues of the Saint often depict him holding the child Jesus.

Anthony travelled through towns, villages and cities and preached with unwearied zeal and also preached in countries like France and Italy. In 1227, he was elected Minister Provincial of Friars living in North Italy. Due to austere penance and intense preaching, his health began to fail. After receiving the last sacraments, he kept looking upward with a smile on his countenance, for he said, "I see my Lord". He breathed his last on 13<sup>th</sup> June 1231, at the young age of 36. He was declared a saint the very next year, and was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1946. One of his most noted sayings is: "the life of the body is the soul, and the life of the soul is God".
