KNOW YOUR CONGREGATION - DAUGHTERS OF ST. PAUL

The Congregation of the Daughters of St. Paul, which has a house in the Marian Zone of our Parish, celebrates the centenary year of its foundation this June. The Congregation was founded in Alba, Italy in the year 1915 by Blessed James Alberione, the founder of the Society of St. Paul. He was the founder of five religious congregations, including the Pious Disciples of the Divine Master (PDDM), which has a house located in St. Paul's Zone of our Parish.

The Daughters of St. Paul, also known as the Pauline Sisters, are called to live by the way, truth and life of Jesus and to give this to the world by the use of every available means of communication, to spread the Gospel and promote the dignity of all peoples. They carry out a new form of evangelization by living and witnessing to the Faith through communications. The sisters are active in whatever media best serves evangelization, from traditional publications to ebooks, from TV to social media, from the internet to mobile apps — working in the areas of writing, publishing, recording and broadcasting, screenwriting, media literacy, religious education, adult faith formation and spiritual development.

The Daughters of St. Paul trace their history in India back to 1951 when they started out in Mumbai. Today they have a total of 14 houses and run 15 Pauline Book & Media Centers nationwide. In a few places, they also run Catholic Enquiry Centres, Libraries or Book Centre Extensions for other Catholic Religious or Diocesan Institutions.

The Congregation opened their house in Bangalore in 1952. Today they have 21 sisters in the community including 9 juniors, of which 2 are preparing themselves for their final commitment. Seven of them are doing their college from St. Joseph's Evening College. Each Sister takes her inspiration from St. Paul the Apostle, as their Bl. Alberione directed them: "If Saint Paul were living today, he would continue to burn with that double flame from a single fire, zeal for God

and respect in the countries to which they come.

The Daughters of St. Paul run the 'Pauline Book and Media Centre' on Museum Road, just neighboring our parish compound. In addition, they also run one at St. John's Medical College. Besides, one of the sisters of the congregation is the Directress of the Archdiocesan Catholic Enquiry Center. The Bangalore branch is also active in several activities such as organizing Bible weeks and Bible Sundays in parishes of the Archdiocese, book displays at various institutions and parishes, books and AV displays at school venues, Christmas programs for the less privileged and the Association of Pauline Cooperators - a group of the laity who assist the Congregation.
